AB 62/Wood A – Housing & Comm Develop	Requires all public housing agencies to implement policies prohibiting the smoking of tobacco products in all public housing units, interior areas, and outdoor areas within 25 feet of public housing and administrative buildings by 7/30/18. AB 63/Frazier A – Trans	Expands the scope of the provisional licensing program by extending the applicable age range for the program from 16 to under 21 years of age. Under current law, this would prohibit these drivers from driving alone, without a licensed driver over the age of 25, between the hours of 11pm and 5am or transport passengers under the age of 20, unless for medical necessity, for school or school-authorized activities, employment, or other exceptions. AB 64/Bonta	Applies advertising restrictions on licensees of the medical cannabis system. Defines non-storefront dispensaries (delivery services). 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AB 74/Chiu A – Health	Creates the Housing for a Healthy California program to be administered by the Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD) with competitive grants going to counties or cities collaborating with a county in the program. HCD would draft guidelines to fund the grants, which could be used for long-term rental assistance or interim housing. Applicants must identify a source of funding that could include county GF, WPC pilot program funds, the Health Home Program or other county-controlled funding. AB 179/Cervantes A – Trans Amended 2/14/17	Changes the qualifications for members of the CA Transportation Commission (CTC). Requires two members to have experience working directly with communities in CA most significantly impacted by high levels of pollution including communities that are racially or ethnically diverse or low-income. Requires one member with training or expertise in sustainable transportation including bike or pedestrian safety, one member with training or expertise in sustainable transportation including transit, one member with training or expertise (or authority) on the public health effects of transportation, and one member with training expertise (or authority) on climate change mitigation. Creates the Environmental Justice Advisory Committee to advise the CTC in its allocation and programming of transportation funding. Requires DHCS to develop a comprehensive and multicultural public education program to combat the heroin and opioid abuse epidemic in CA. Delineates the elements of the public education campaign. Amends death certificates to now include information on the occurrence of any antimicrobial-resistant infection that in the physicians judgement was a factor in the person’s death.
