- Each LHJ contributed varying numbers of objectives and/or metrics within the Strategic Plans. Therefore, the top priorities were ranked based on the highest number of LHJs indicating the domain as an area of focus
- 4 out of 10 LHJs provided metrics within the Strategic Plans; therefore, Strategic Plans were assessed only for objective theme overlap.
- LHJ Strategic Plans inform on strategy approaches focusing on process and performance domains. There were more objectives on process and performance domains in comparison to health outcome topic priorities.
