

COUNTY OF EL DORADO HISTORIC GOLD COUNTRY

The County of El Dorado is a charter county and employs more than 1,800 employees with a funded budget of approximately \$909 million. The governing body is the Board of Supervisors, which is comprised of elected representatives from each of the five voting districts.

El Dorado County Libraries serve as Community Hubs and are a network of library and local resource agency navigators who connect families and individuals to support and services. The first public library in El Dorado County was a small Placerville City Library established in 1906 on the upper floor of Confidence Hall. Then in 1947 a group of citizens began the work of establishing a County Free Library. This early Friends of the Library group raised funds and bought the old A.S. Fox house. Since then, El Dorado County Library has grown to six branches throughout the County, as well as two outreach vehicles.

El Dorado County encompasses 1,786 square miles that range from the eastern edge of the Sacramento Valley to the peaks of the Sierra Nevada. Our western border is 30 minutes from the State Capitol and only 20 minutes away from over one million acres of breathtaking national forest. The vast size of our County also means that our offices are spread from El Dorado Hills to South Lake Tahoe. Of course, our services are not just office-based, as the County of El Dorado also maintains the famous Rubicon Trail, manages the whitewater recreation on the South Fork of the American River, educates visitors on our Gold Rush days at the El Dorado County Historical Museum, and provides many other services to our residents and visitors.

The selected candidate will have the opportunity to:

- Serve as the individual in charge during a declared incident or emergency including, as appropriate, declaration of a Public Health Emergency.
- Take appropriate measure to prevent and control epidemics; enforces orders, rules, and regulations for quarantine or isolation required by the State Department of Health Services.
- Establish and maintain medical standards and protocols for medical staff.
- Participate in clinical and medical management decisions.
- Act as Medical Epidemiologist for public health diseases.

THE QUALIFICATIONS

Possession of a Doctor of Medicine degree or a Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine degree issued by an accredited medical school in good standing; AND two (2) years of full-time experience functioning as a Public Health Officer or administering a public health program with responsibility for administration, supervision, and effective functioning of the program. A master's degree in public health is desirable.

Licenses and Certifications:

- Possession of a valid license to practice medicine issued by the Medical Board of California.
- Possession of Board Certification from the American Board of Preventive Medicine is desirable.
