Dr. Ron Chapman is a public health physician who has dedicated his career to eliminating health inequities and improving the health of communities in California and the nation. He is a special consultant to the Director's Office of the California Department of Public Health (CDPH). He is on the board of directors of the Public Health Accreditation Board (PHAB), serves on the executive committee, and is the Chair of the accreditation committee.

From 2015-2020 Dr. Chapman was the Yolo County public health officer and led the department to national accreditation in 2017. From 2011-2015 he served as the director and state health officer of CDPH and led the department to national accreditation in 2014. He was the chief medical officer of Partnership HealthPlan of California (PHC), a managed care Medi-Cal health plan. For six years he was the health officer and director of public health in Solano County, California. From 1998 to 2004, he worked at the California Department of Health Services as the founding chief of the Medicine and Public Health section. Dr. Chapman served as the County Health Executives Association of California (CHEAC) president and sat on the California Conference of Local Health Officers (CCLHO) board of directors and executive committee. Before entering full-time public health, Dr. Chapman was on the faculty at the University of California, Davis School of Medicine.
