### **Christa McCauley, MFA, Program Manager**

Christa McCauley serves as a Program Manager for Sutter County, currently overseeing the implementation of the CalAIM Justice Involved (JI) Initiative for the Sutter County Jail. Christa has dedicated a decade of her career to Sutter County, first in employment and eligibility working in Medi-Cal and CalFresh and then transitioning to Sutter County Public Health in the Health Navigator program. She stepped into her role overseeing the CalAIM JI Initiative in 2024 and helped Sutter to implement the program in the second cohort of approved counties to go live by the Department of Health Care Services, utilizing her knowledge of Medi-Cal, stakeholder engagement, and program management.

Christa holds both a bachelor's in creative writing and a Master of Fine Arts degree in English-Creative Writing from Southern New Hampshire University. She graduated Summa Cum Laude and is a member of the International English Society and the National Society of Leadership and Success.

### **Stephanie Lucio, Project Manager**

Stephanie Lucio serves as a Project Manager for Yuba County, currently overseeing the implementation of the CalAIM Justice Involved (JI) Initiative for the Yuba County Jail and the Tri-County Youth Campus. With a decade of service to Yuba County, Stephanie brings a wealth of experience in public health and justice-involved systems. She spent eight years with Yuba County Public Health, providing supervisory and management oversight, before transitioning to the Sheriff's Department in December 2023 to support the planning and implementation of CalAIM JI.

Under her leadership, Yuba County became one of only three counties in California to receive conditional approval from the Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) to go live with CalAIM JI in October 2024. As one of the early implementers of this first-in-the-nation initiative, Stephanie has played a key role in advancing the project statewide by sharing insights, lessons learned, and strategic considerations with peer counties and state partners.

Stephanie holds Associate degrees in General Studies and Paralegal Studies from the University of Alaska, Fairbanks, a Bachelor's degree in Business Administration from American Military University, and a Project Management Certificate from California State University, Sacramento.
