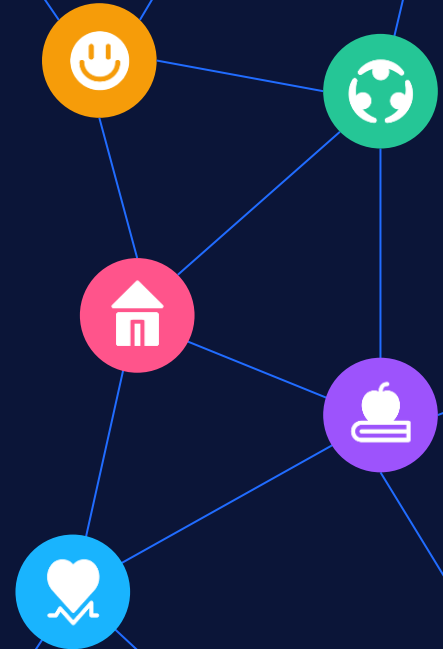

## Ideas to streamline referral management

Establish closed-loop referral systems that enable secure, real-time sharing of client information and referral outcomes across departments, reducing administrative burden and ensuring clients receive timely support

Work collectively to utilize data and analytics to identify unmet social needs, track service utilization, measure collective impact, and pinpoint areas for targeted intervention
